

How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them. What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? SHARE LIFE

In the Gospel for Ash Wednesday, Jesus spoke about the three disciplines of Lent; Prayer, Fasting and Alms giving. By embracing these disciplines, we try to draw closer to Jesus who has told us that he is the way, the truth and the life. In the giving of alms, we try to be like Jesus in his giving of himself to others. SHARE LIFE, is one of the collective ways that we do this. The campaign was begun by Archbishop Pocock in 1976, as a way for the people of the Archdiocese to reach out to those who are most in need, and for the past 48 years we have done this. I would like to thank you for your generosity to the campaign last year. The Parish gave \$151.356.55 to the campaign, which I believe is a very tangible way of saying that we care, and that we support this campaign. I hope that this year we will be able to do the same. The second collection will be on APRIL 28, and another on JUNE 2, but donations can be given at any time either directly through the Parish or through the Share Life Office. Please make sure that donations are allocated to "Share Life - St. Patrick's Parish." If you have not already received it, you will be receiving a letter from Archbishop Leo asking for your continuing support. There are envelopes for the collections in your Parish box of envelopes, as well as on the tables in the church, and in the letter from Archbishop Leo. There is a brochure in the bulletin this weekend similar to the one that you received from the Archbishop. It talks about those who have been helped by Share Life, and the allocation of the funds that have been received. Thank you for your support and generosity.-Fr. John

March for Life

The theme for this year's March for Life is "I will never forget you." (Isaiah 49:15-16) God's promise that He will "never forget" is a call for each one of us to be a witness to the dignity of every human life, from conception to natural death. Since 1969, 4 million babies in Canada have been aborted. The number of deaths by euthanasia has increased from 1,018 in 2016 to 13,241 in 2022, for a total of 44,958 (latest statistics). As Christians, we cannot be silent when there are attacks on innocent life. To be silent is to be morally complicit. Join thousands of Canadians in Ottawa on Thursday, May 9, 2024 to march for life.
