


Pandemic Diary

Then they come into full view and wow! They are tall, really tall and each one is really different than the one beside

it. There are lots of trees, yes, but there are also lots of unique features that give these mountains their names. How can you get closer? Get on a helicopter and fly across the range into the interior. There are mountain goats on the top peak just lazing about! There are really deep and cold lakes from the melting snows of glaciers around you. There are valleys and peaks everywhere. The largest glacier around is in the Columbia Icefields, the Athabasca Glacier.

The southernmost country on the African continent, South Africa has so much to offer by way of topography, natural beauty and cultural diversity. Cape Town on the Southwest coast is SA's second largest city after Johannesburg and has the flattopped Table Mountain as an iconic landmark. A layer of clouds, called the "tablecloth" frequently cloaks the mountain's peak, but when the clouds clear, visitors can enjoy spectacular views of the city and the entire Cape Peninsula from the summit. The famous Victoria and Alfred Waterfront is another vantage point and buzzes with activity and musicians gathering to entertain people. Cape Agulhas is the southernmost point of Africa. The waters of the Indian and Atlantic oceans mingle and make for some rough currents.

Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens are part of the Cape Floristic Region UNESCO World Heritage site hosting over 20,000 native South African plant species including SA's "Fynbos", a floral kingdom of plants.

Sisal plants and giant aloes are seen almost everywhere in the Karoo, a semi-desert region of the cape. Oudtshoorn is the ostrich capital of the world. The ostrich egg fascinates me as

In 1969, Theresa Darrigo invited me to a CWL meeting at the old church hall where Father Howe was Pastor. At my very first meeting, I was elected Education Convenor. I organized Public Speaking Contests and arranged speakers during Education week with Jesse Flis, former Federal MP for Parkdale.


In the early 70's I loved becoming the Resolution and Legislation Convenor. One of my biggest accomplishments was **redrafting the pornography resolution** for more censorship. This was then presented at the Toronto Archdiocesan Convention. As a result of this, I was asked to join the Toronto Archdiocesan Council alongside President, Peggy Nastasiuk. I also returned to law school which enabled me to gain valuable information and resources toward this cause. For decades, I worked with the League at the Provincial and National levels as Sub Convenor in resolutions. Any laws passed to protect children were the result of a team of players with the same goal.

I was pleased to be part of starting our first Newsletter, receiving the Maple Leaf pin and a trophy from National.

It was quite a journey of Faith and Action AND Catholic women who moved the boulders that obstructed the path on that journey. Yep, we did it. Together.

Socially, the CWL filled my life as I was connected to and working with women of deep faith who practiced and lived it. For those times in my life, I will always be grateful. I more than appreciate what the League did for me at a time in my life when I needed a support system. Immeasurable!! The CWL means something to those who have lived it and really it belongs to them.

St Patrick's CWL would like to thank you Irene for all your efforts especially in the fight against child pornography. Beginning with the **WRAP** campaign (White Ribbon Against Pornography) in 1988, **C.A.S.E.** (Canadians Against Sexual Exploitation) and **Pornography Hurts Everyone** in 2013, these efforts continue to rid our society of this plague.

Scones! Scones! by Susan & Laura Macera

Cheese & Chive

Ingredients

2 cups All Purpose Flour, 3/4 teaspoon Kosher salt, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon baking soda, 1 teaspoon sugar, 1 cup of buttermilk, 8 tablespoons of butter (additional 1 tablespoon for brushing), 1&1/4 cup cheddar cheese, 1/4 cup chives **Method** Mix all dry ingredients together (including the cheese and chives) in a mixing bowl. Chill buttermilk for 10 mins, add melted butter to it and pour into bowl with dry ingredients. Preheat oven to 400 deg F. Scoop dough with spoon or ice-cream scoop onto parchment lined baking tray. Brush with butter. Bake for 10-15 mins until golden brown.

Strawberry

Ingredients

I cup diced strawberries (blot dry with paper towel to remove moisture), I cup heavy cream, I stick butter, 2 cups all purpose flour, I/4 cup granulated sugar, I tablespoon baking powder, I/2 teaspoon salt

Method

Preheat oven to 400deg F.

Chill cream in freezer for 10 mins, add melted butter to it and gently mix with fork to form globules or clumps.

Add the butter/cream mix to the dry ingredients and incorporate until batter moves away from side of bowl (do not overmix). Scoop dough onto parchment lined baking tray with spoon or ice cream scoop and bake for 15 mins.

For Glaze

In a small saucepan, bring 1/4 cup granulated sugar, 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice, I tablespoon butter to boil, then simmer for 4-6 mins until mixture begins to thicken. Remove from heat, brush baked scones with prepared glaze and return to oven for 3-5 mins. Remove and transfer to cooling rack. Enjoy!!
