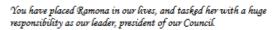

Armchair Travelogue with Barbara Azzopardi $featuring \, Salzburg \, with \, Lena \, Griffatong$

This month Lena takes us on a tour of Salzburg, Austria, a city that she spent most of her childhood in and has fond memories

Salzburg is famous for being the birthplace of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. He was born there on the 27th January, 1756 and his apartment on No 9 Getreidegasse is now a museum displaying his musical instruments and other memorabilia. It is also the site of the internationally renowned annual Salzburg Festival which consists of recitals, concerts of orchestral and chamber music. church music, opera, and drama. The music of Mozart is an important part of the festival. Mozart Square is dominated by a Mozart monument that was unveiled in 1842.

Music" movie? It was filmed in Salzburg. The Leopoldskron Schloss (Palace) which appeared as the Von Trapp family home, Nonnberg Abbey where Maria was a nun are all places of interest on a 'Hills are Alive" tour, a top tourist attraction. Lena actually lived 5 minutes away from Leoploldskron Schloss. She fondly remembers the lake or big pond as she likes to call it, with swans and ducks swimming in it. Every summer, everyone was permitted to take a dip and cool off. Fishing was another favourite activity along the banks. In winter, Lena remembers skating over the frozen pond and even walking across sometimes. She loved biking all around the lake to get to town where she worked for a veterinarian.

Remember the popular "Sound of The Salzburg Cathedral is one of the city's most beautiful landmarks in the historic centre. The original cathedral was completed in 774 but was destroyed in a fire. The new cathedral was consecrated in 1628. The baroque style building features a crypt, seven bells, a baptismal font where famous composers where baptized, and even graffiti that's about 400 years old. Ever since 1920, a famous play called Die Jedermann (Everyman) is performed in the Cathedral Square during the Salzburg Festival.

> The medieval Hohensalzburg Fortress (Die Festung), perched on Mönchsberg (Monks' Hill), overlooking the entire city is a must-see attraction. It is accessible by a funicular railway. It is the largest, fully preserved medieval castle in Central Europe. It is famous for the historical



Salzburg Bull, a 200 pipe organ built in 1502, is still played thrice daily from Psalm Sunday to October 31st. The historical armory, marionette museum and ornate princely chambers can still be appreciated today.

Hellbrunn Schloss und Wasserspiele (trick fountains) have amazed visitors for over 400 years! The teeming waters flowing down from Hellbrunn mountain essentially predestined water to become a central design element. At the heart of the grounds are the Mannerist "Trick Fountains", which are quite unparalleled in the world today, attributed to the mischievous Prince -Archbishop Markus Sittikus who built this palace for recreation.



And this article would be incomplete without mention of the beautiful Mirabell Schloss and gardens. It was built in 1606 as a token of love, by Prince-Archbishop Wolf Dietrich von Raitenau and has immaculate, manicured gardens and a grand Marble Hall which is considered one of the most beautiful wedding halls in the world. A string ensemble often performs classical masterpieces like "Four Seasons" by Vivaldi and Mozart's "Salzburg Symphonies" in this Hall and is not to be missed.



Lena cherishes Austria. When she visits Vienna, she must sample Apple strudel with whipped cream, Sacher Torte (chocolate cake with apricot jam) and Wiener Schnitzel. One of her favourite cafes is Cafe Aida. Check it out if you visit Vienna.

Hannah prayed to God and vowed that if He gave her a son, she would arrange for her son to serve at the temple. God answered Hannah's prayer and she gave birth to Samuel. When Samuel was a boy, Hannah kept her promise and took him to be raised in the

temple, continuing to guide and mentor him.

God blessed Hannah with five more children, three sons and two daughters. Hannah's prayers helped her to endure trials and reflects her deep faith in God. "It is not by strength that one prevails; those who oppose the Lord will be shattered. He will thunder against them from heaven; the Lord will judge the ends of the earth" (1 Sam. 2:10)

Hannah trusted God and her story teaches us that our faith in God allows Him to bless us. Her trust in God when she turned to him and her faithfulness in bringing Samuel to God are evidences of God working in Hannah's life.

Hannah's son Samuel later rescued Israel from centuries of slavery to the Canaanites and idolatry to Baal by anointing King David, whose heart was devoted to the Lord and who gifted God's people with most of the Psalms.
