Reflections of a CWL Sister Andrea Tijoe

In the early 1990's, I was a 9am to 5pm office administrator, and 5pm to 9am Mom of 2 teen boys, a wife and also an untrained caregiver to my bed-ridden mother-in-law for 5 years, then for my father-in-law, who passed away in 2005. Did I have time for anything else?

Then one Sunday, when our Parish' CWL was holding an international food fest, Gayle (then President of our Council) invited me to host a table with Indonesian food. If only she knew that baking and cooking were not my specialty, but what the heck, anything for an excuse to do something and to be somewhere else other than work and home. Little did I know that it would be the beginning of my CWL journey!

I really enjoyed the experience and was in awe with the works of the CWL women, but mostly, I loved how they always began their meetings with a prayer and reflection. So I decided to join the League.

I immediately became very involved, serving wherever and whenever things needed to get done, from organizing events & bake sales (definitely not the baking part), signed-up as a lector, worked with Altar servers, etc. I was then asked to serve as President of St. Patrick's Parish Council, then on to Regional and Toronto Diocesan level, trainer of Leadership courses, etc. Being involved with the Catholic Women's League gave me the emotional support that I needed, the sisterhood and a sense of self-worth.

Each gathering with my CWL sisters, whether for a Parish Council meeting, a convention, special CWL event, prayer service and even coffee with one or more CWL sisters, served as an affirmation of God's love for me.

To all my League sisters, my companions on the journey, thank you for your affirmation, love, and gentle guidance to ensure that I stay focused in reaching my destination, where God wants me to be.

Mary Gardens by Ramona da Cunha

Have you ever planted a Mary Garden? It is a place of beauty and serenity, inviting prayer and contemplation, with plants named in honour of Mary and Jesus. The plants can remind you of

- Mary's features eg her eyes

 (Forget-me-nots), her 5 fingers
 (Potentilla), her veil (Baby's breath), her shoes (Columbine)
- Mary's attributes eg her humility (violets), her Queenship (Lily)
- Mary's life eg her bitter sorrow (Dandelion), her tears (Lily of the Valley), her Assumption (Plantation Lily Hosta)

How do you create such a garden?

- Pick a quiet, shady spot outdoors or perhaps consider an indoor miniature garden
- ♦ Include an image of Mary as the focal point
- Select your plants according to Zone, level of your gardening expertise and consider some of the plants described in this article.
- Add meaningful accents like painted rocks, shells etc
- Perhaps even consider using Native Pollinator plants that not only ecologically beneficial but also promote biodiversity. They can also be

spiritually fulfilling ex Eastern Red Columbine can represent Mary's shoes or Yarrow can replace Baby's Breath as her veil.





Potato Chip Chocolate Chip Recipe contributed by Marie and Brigitte

Ingredients

2 sticks (1 cup) unsalted butter, softened, 3/4 cup granulated sugar, 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar, 2 teaspoons Vanilla extract, 2 large eggs, 2 cups all-purpose flour, I teaspoon baking soda I teaspoon kosher salt, I cup semisweet chocolate chips, 4 cups crushed potato chips (8 ounces), such as Lay's

Directions

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment.

In the bowl of a stand mixer, cream together the butter, granulated sugar and brown sugar on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, 3 to 5 minutes. Add the vanilla and eggs and beat on medium speed until just combined. Add the flour, baking soda and salt, then mix on low speed until just combined. Stir in the chocolate chips and 2 cups of the crushed potato chips. Put the remaining 2 cups crushed potato chips in a shallow bowl.

Roll the dough into 2-inch balls, then roll them in the remaining potato chips so they are completely coated. Place the cookies 2 inches apart on the prepared baking sheets and bake until golden, 12 to 15 minutes. Let cool for 5 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

If you move it, put it back.


If it belongs to someone else and you want to use it, get permission.

If you don't know how to operate it, leave it alone. If it's none of your business, don't ask questions.


If it ain't broke, don't fix it.
